The public meeting for the Delaware County Jail Oversight Board was held on Tuesday, December 14, 2021 at 4:30 pm in the Delaware County Council Meeting Room, Government Center Building, Media, PA.

Present: Kevin Madden, Chair; Joanne Phillips, Vice Chair; Howard Lazarus, Executive Director; Honorable John J. Whelan; Honorable Mary Alice Brennan; Deborah Love, Citizen Appointment; Brian Corson, Citizen Appointment; Jonathan King, Citizen Appointment.

Also, in attendance were Shelley Smith, Esq., of Archer & Greiner, PC and Majid Alsayegh of Alta Management.

Public Comment on Agenda Items: There were no comments on agenda items.

Approval of the November Meeting Minutes: Motion made by Mr. King to approve the minutes from the November JOB meeting, seconded by Mr. Corson. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the November Warden's Report: Motion made by Controller Phillips to approve the Warden's Report for November 2021, seconded by Ms. Love. Motion carried unanimously.

Staffing Penalty approval for November 2021: Acting Warden Donna Mellon presented the November Staffing Penalties. Motion made by Controller Phillips to approve the November 2021 Staffing Penalties, seconded by Judge Brennan. Motion carried unanimously.

Coronavirus Update: In November, there were 169 inmates tested with 2 new infections, both were asymptomatic. Inmates continue being tested prior to transfer. There were 6 staff members tested with 1 new infection. The staff member has not returned to work yet. There were 103 new commits who had reported that they were vaccinated. The current vaccination rate is 31%. ACME provided a vaccination clinic on Wednesday, December 1<sup>st</sup>. There were 53 inmates who had received vaccinations. There will be another vaccination clinic in early January.

Discussion of Contraband: There were 8,645 cell searches, 88 K9 searches and 7 shakedowns in November. There were two car searches on different shifts with no contraband found. Recently there were multiple contraband finds in the jail including narcotics, jail made weapons and a cell phone. Ms. Mellon continues to work with the CID, GEO staff, and the GTL Analyst to combat contraband in the facility. The number of shakedowns has increased and random urinalysis testing as well. All incidents regarding contraband and assaults are referred to CID for investigation and possible prosecution.

Appointment of Laura Williams as Warden: Motion made by Mr. Lazarus to appoint Laura Williams as the new Warden of George W. Hill, seconded by Ms. Corson. Motion carried unanimously. Mr. Lazarus mentioned that Ms. Williams started her professional career with a degree in psychology from the University of Pittsburgh and later received a master's degree in Counseling Psychology. Ms. Williams' career path started with family counseling and migrated into counseling individuals with substance use disorder, which has led her to the field of corrections. Ms. Williams is currently Deputy Chief Warden at Allegheny Correctional Facility.

Discussion of Audit Services: There was discussion of a 3-year contract that was entered by the former Prison Board in 2019 for Christopher Reynolds, Inc. Controller Phillips noted that the work was bank reconciliations and could be brought in house. Judge Brennan and Judge Whelan would like Controller Phillips to wait until there is a clear recommendation made by the JOB to terminate the contract. Motion made by Controller Phillips to terminate the contract with Christopher Reynolds, Inc., subject to Solicitor's approval. Motion was seconded by Ms. Love; Judge Brennan was nay.

De-privatization Update: Mr. Alsayegh mentioned that weekly meetings are being held with GEO management to coordinate the transition. The team is working with personnel, HR and County IT. Lisa Rydell is documenting the systems necessary for purchase during the transition. Mr. Alsayegh welcomed new Transition Manager Lisa Mastroddi and introduced HR firm, JUNO to the JOB.

JUNO Presentation: Jennifer Kalcheski, of JUNO Search Partners introduced herself as well as Vice President of Growth and Strategy, Steve Britten and Talent Manager, Alexis Redcross. JUNO is working with Warden Mellon and Ms. Mastroddi on the transition and focusing on the talent process. JUNO is working on several initiatives to ensure adequate staffing and that internal and incumbent staff feel valued, recognized and heard.

Mr. Madden noted that an executive session was held by the JOB on Monday, December 13<sup>th</sup> to discuss proposals for Food Services, Commissary and Maintenance Services at George W. Hill.

Discussion and award of the Food Services contract: The selection committee had made a unanimous recommendation that council award Aramark the contract for Food Services at George W. Hill. Motion made by Controller Phillips to recommend that council award Aramark the contract for Food Services, subject to Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. Corson. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and award of the Commissary contract: The selection committee had made a unanimous recommendation that council award Aramark the contract for Commissary. Motion made by Judge Brennan to recommend that council award Aramark the contract for Commissary, subject to Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. Corson. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and award of the Maintenance contract: The selection committee made a unanimous recommendation that council award US Facilities the contract for Maintenance at George W. Hill. Motion made by Judge Brennan to recommend that council award US Facilities the contract to provide Maintenance at George W. Hill, subject to Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. King. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Comment: Robert Ciccinelli 6 East North 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Havertown, PA: Mr. Ciccinelli thanked Acting Warden Donna Mellon and Compliance Administrator Sarah Bowles for accommodating the tour last week with Delco CPR and the Pennsylvania Prison Society. During the tour Mr. Ciccinelli spoke with multiple inmates who had reported issues such as lock downs, jail conditions, security and staffing shortages.

Jennifer Murphy, 639 Woodcrest Avenue, Ardmore, PA: Ms. Murphy also attended the tour with Delco CPR and the Pennsylvania Prison Society. Ms. Murphy expressed concern regarding medical care for female inmates. Ms. Murphy requested that the inmates have access to cleaning supplies while they are on lockdown.

Mr. Seifudden Simpson, 1030 Potter Street, Chester, PA: mentioned that he was in George W. Hill several times over the past 20 years. Once released, Mr. Simpson received his master's degree from Villanova. Mr. Simpson thanked the JOB and County Council for helping the residents of Delaware County.

There was no further business, nor public comment. Motion made by Ms. Phillips to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Ms. Love.

### Work Essential Skill/Computer Instruction (WES)

WES course is geared to life skills applications. The curriculum leads the individual through interviewing skills, proper dress codes, how to achieve good credit, job seeking methods and how to prepare a resume. Thirty hours of instruction will earn a certificate along with a finished resume. A total of *172* inmates benefited from this life skills course during 2021.

### Flagger Training

Flagger certification enables the inmate to apply for flagging positions upon release. Course is taught in accordance with PENN DOT guidelines and inmate must pass the final exam for certification. Flagging on any roadway in Pennsylvania requires this type of certification. A total of 69 inmates received this training during 2021.

The chart below reflects the number of inmates that participated in the educational treatment programs for the month of December, 2021.

During the month there were <u>84</u> inamtes that participated in Education Treatment Programs.

### PREP I (CBI-SA) Cognitive Behavioral Interventions for Substance Abuse

This program is an eight-week evidenced based cognitive behavioral program (CBI-SA) that focuses on educating inmates on addictions and behaviors. This program provides a comprehensive understanding of addictions, copying skills, and relapse prevention skills. The therapeutic framework is CBISA (Cognitive Behavioral Intervention for Substance Abuse). This program is open to all inmates regardless of court status. All participants receive a certificate of completion. Attendance is mandatory. All participants' progress tracked and documented (i.e. weekly progress notes/discharge summaries).

### PREP II (T4C) Thinking for a Change

This program is geared toward repeat offenders who successfully completed PREP I (CBI-SA) and/or a community-based treatment program. Unlike PREP 1, which focuses on addictions; this program places great emphasize on cognitive restructuring and social skills building. PREP II utilizes the (T4C) Thinking for a Change Model. The overall goal of this program is to address the cognitive, social, and emotional needs of the criminal justice population. This program

includes daily treatment assignments, active participation, and after care planning. To successfully complete program, all participants must complete 25 sessions. A strong emphasis placed on compliance with the program rules and regulations. Eligible participants must have previously completed PREP I and/or show a sense of motivation or desire toward change.

❖ December had <u>84</u> inmates that participated in PREP 1 and PREP 2 classes for the month. Twenty-Three (23) inmates received a certificate of completion (10 males, 13 females).

### Anger Management

Anger Management is an eight-session treatment program for inmates with stress and issues regarding anger and impulsivity. The program based on Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) approach to treatment. Wellness techniques focus on relaxation strategies practiced throughout the program. The Anger Management Program is currently suspended due to position vacancy.

### Sex Offender/Behavior Modification

The Sex Offender Program is a twenty-week treatment program for inmates who have committed a sexual offense. The program looks at the root causes of the individuals committing the offense and develops strategies on futuristic coping mechanisms. The Sex Offender/Behavior Modification Program is currently suspended due to position vacancy.

### House of Healing Program

The House of Healing Program is a twelve-week treatment program for inmates who have experienced issues of loss or trauma as children and throughout their lives. The House of Healing Program is currently suspended due to position vacancy.

# Parenting Support Group for Males and Female Populations

Parenting Support Classes offers the attendees the opportunity to learn how to care for one another in a relationship, their child's development, how to communicate to each other's physical and emotional needs, family activities and the family functioning as a cohesive unit. The Parenting Support Group Program is currently suspended due to position vacancy.

### Transgender Group/Transmissions

The Transmissions program meets with the transgender population and persons contemplating transgender options. Discussions of human sexuality along with coping skills in the prison environment are the focus of discussion. The session includes PREA issues and outside resource information. The Transgender Group Program is currently suspended due to position vacancy.

### Wellness Program

G.W. Hill Correctional Facilities Wellness Program is a resolution program designed to provide lasting results by shifting the inmate's behaviors to produce sustainable and measurable results through classroom education and supervised wellness training.

Wellness Coordinator focuses on what is considered the most common criminogenic needs and traits. These include substance abuse, antisocial cognitions, family relations, work and leisure activities and the program will provide positive outlets and responses for potentially compromising situations they may find themselves in upon release. Educational instruction and fitness through weight lifting, team games, cardio and body weight workouts provide the desired outcomes for the inmate to incorporate into their daily lives.

The Wellness Coordinator works closely with several groups of inmates and staff which include the juvenile population, case managers, medical staff, counselors and correctional staff. At this time the wellness program is offered to the medical unit, vivitrol unit and youthful offenders until such time that the health and safety of the population is no longer at risk from the coronavirus. Monthly workout regimes are posted on units who are not currently attending wellness programming.

### Naloxone Distribution

Inmates are offered a single dose of Naloxone (*Narcan*) to take with them during the discharge process on a voluntary basis. Since program inception of April 16, 2020 to December, 2021, there has been **181** doses distributed to discharging inmates.
