PRESENT: Mario J. Civera, Jr., Chairman; Colleen P. Morrone, Vice Chairman; John P. McBlain, Council Member; David J. White, Council Member; Michael F. Culp, Council Member; Edward O'Lone, Controller; Marianne Grace, Executive Director; Michael L. Maddren, Solicitor; Anne M. Coogan, County Clerk; and other department heads.

Chairman Civera called the regular meeting of June 3, 2015 to order followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag led by Meaghan Manfre, an intern in the Personnel Department. Maureen Dillon, of the Department of Information Technology, gave the invocation.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 27, 2015, seconded by Mr. McBlain and carried unanimously.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving to purchase under the COSTARS Contract for the Human Services Department fifty-six (56) Microsoft Surface Pro 3 Tablets PC's with laptop docking stations, keyboards and carrying cases, two (2) HP Laser Jet printers and twenty-nine (29) Dell OptiPlex 7020 Mini Tower desktop computers with 4-year warranties in the amount of \$96,558.40. (State funding) The motion is subject to the Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. White and carried unanimously.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving Central Tax Collection Department's request for a refund for the year 2015 County Real Estate Taxes for 1 property owner due to the overpayment of the amount of taxes due, seconded by Mr. Culp and carried unanimously.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving Professional Services Agreement between the County of Delaware and Dennis J. Carey, P.E. for the provision of Engineering Services required for the administration of the Department of Public Works for the period of 6/28/2015 through 6/30/2017 for an annual fee not to exceed \$65,000.00. The motion is subject to the Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. McBlain and carried unanimously.

Chairman Civera called on Linda Hill, Director of Planning/OHCD, to speak on Agenda Item 8.

Ms. Hill asked for County Council's approval to apply to PennDOT for a grant in the amount of \$86,441.00 under the Community Traffic Safety Program. If they are successful with this application, the funds will be passed through to the Delaware County Transportation Management Association where they would carry-out pedestrian, elderly and teen safety initiatives as well as seatbelt checks at local high school and child car seat checks to the community.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving the submission of a Grant application to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) in the amount of \$86,441.00. The Delaware County Planning Department will partner with the Delaware County Transportation Management Association (DCTMA) and apply for the Community Traffic Safety Project Grant

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through PennDOT's Bureau of Maintenance Operations. The motion is subject to the Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. White and carried unanimously.

Chairman Civera called on Joe Dougherty, Director of Human Services, to speak on Agenda Item 9.

Mr. Dougherty asked for the approval of the Fiscal Year 15/16 Contracts with the Human Services Department Providers of Service. This is for all the providers that fall under Human Services.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving Item 9, Agreements, Contracts and Amendments with the Human Services Provider of Services as per the attached list. The motion is subject to the Solicitor's approval, seconded by Mr. McBlain and carried unanimously.

Chairman Civera called on Mr. Culp to speak on Agenda Item 10, a Resolution recognizing Springfield Ford-Lincoln staff and associates for a generous donation to three organizations that support police, firefighters and emergency medical service personnel.

Mr. Culp said, in Delaware County, we are privileged to have many individuals who step up to the plate on a daily basis to donate their time and talent to serve others. Today, we are pleased to recognize several businessmen who literally put the pedal to the metal to raise funds for our heroes in public safety.

The owner of Springfield Ford-Lincoln dealership, Jim Thomas, and his associate Steve Amabile, took part in a nationwide fundraising program sponsored by Lincoln Motors to raise funds for non-profit organizations. These men reached out to Springfield Police Chief Joe Daly and Township Manager Lee Fulton, who help coordinate fundraising for the Delaware County Fallen Firefighter & EMS Committee and the Delaware County Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation.

On October 4, 2014, they held the Lincoln 2015 MKC Test Drive Event at the Springfield Mall. People were invited to test drive any of the new Lincoln vehicles. If at least 300 drivers tested one of these vehicles, the dealership would receive \$10,000.00 to donate to a non-profit organization of their choice. They reached their goal even though it was pouring rain! The first two test drivers were State Representative Bill Adolf and State Senator Tom McGarrigle. \$10,000.00 was raised that day with an additional \$2,000.00 donation from Springfield Ford-Lincoln totaling \$12,000.00.

The money raised is being divided between the Delaware County Hero Scholarship Fund (\$6,000.00), the Delaware County Fallen Firefighter & EMS Memorial (\$3,000.00) and the Delaware County Law Enforcement Foundation (\$3,000.00). Steve Amabile attended today's meeting to formally present the checks to these organizations.

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On behalf of Delaware County Council, Mr. Culp thanked Mr. Amabile for his generous donation and for the time and effort spent in organizing the fundraiser. He also invited our residents out to the next fundraising event, called *The Drive Experience for the Delaware County Fallen Firefighter & EMS Memorial Committee.* This event will take place on Saturday, June 6 at the Springfield Mall from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M.

The following people attended today's meeting in connection with this fundraising event: Springfield Ford & Lincoln Motors Sales Manager Steve Amabile; Lee Fulton, Springfield Township Manager and Fire Marshal; Chief Joe Daly, Springfield Township Police Department; Jeff Rudolph, Springfield Township Comissioner; Robert Woolson, Springfield Fire Chief & Vice President of the Delaware County Fallen Firefighter & EMS Memorial Committee; Richard Heffernan, Jr., President of the Delaware County Fallen Firefighter & EMS Memorial Committee; and James Reardon, President of the Delaware County Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation. Springfield Ford & Lincoln Motors President Jim Thomas was unable to attend.

Mr. Amabile thanked everyone for their participation in last year's fundraising event. It takes a lot of work getting these events together and to be a success. The local firefighters and EMS were very supportive in this effort. He believes Saturday's event will be just as successful.

Chairman Civera announced the 41st season of the Summer Festival in Rose Tree Park. In Delaware County, we are proud to have an excellent parks system where our residents can enjoy outdoor recreation, festivals, charity events, or a walk with their family. One of the exceptional programs that our Department of Parks presents each year is the Summer Festival, a free program of wonderful music, dance and entertainment for all ages. This truly is the best entertainment bargain in the whole region!

This year marks the 41st anniversary of the Summer Festival which started during the county's Bicentennial celebration in 1975. The Summer Festival begins on June 17 with a concert by the Rose Tree Pops Orchestra with the Westminster Presbyterian Choir. There are <u>45</u> live performances, all for free, that run on Wednesday through Sunday evenings. The final concert is on August 16 with a tribute to Eric Clapton.

Some of our Summer Festival performers are also Delaware County residents and we are pleased that we can give local performers a chance to perform for a hometown audience. One of those performers is Sam Parsons, a trombonist, from Wallingford. Mr. Parsons has been playing the trombone for 50 years and will be featured in not one but two concerts during the Summer Festival. On June 24, he will play with the Chester County Concert Band. On July 29, he will play with a band he helped form called "22 Park Avenue," which is a 17-piece band that plays tunes from the Great American Songbook.

Mr. Parsons attended today with fellow performers Dean Anderson, a trumpet player from Wallingford, and Martin Holahan, a trumpet player from Edgmont.

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Marc Manfre thanked County Council and Executive Director Marianne Grace for their continued support of the Summer Festival. He also thanked Beth Chapman, Marketing Coordinator for the Parks and Recreation Department who schedules all the events at Rose Tree Park, and Jeff Rudolph, President of the Parks Board who has served on the board for over fifteen years.

Chairman Civera called on Mr. McBlain to speak on Agenda Item 12, a Resolution recognizing the sixth season of the Philadelphia Union and major league soccer at PPL Park and announcing the documentary on the Sons of Ben Fan Club.

On June 27, 2010 (five years ago), Mr. McBlain said the Philadelphia Union played its first Major League Soccer match at the brand new PPL Park. The Union is still drawing thousands of fans to the stadium for its sixth season. Since the stadium opened, PPL Park and the Philadelphia Union have created energy, entertainment and economic development on the Delaware Riverfront, in Delaware County.

Each game day, Union supporters and diehard fans of the Sons of Ben fill the 18,500 seat stadium. The stadium isn't just used for soccer but has hosted collegiate soccer, football, lacrosse and rugby. Next month, they will host the 2015 Gold Cup Third-Place Match, an event that brings top soccer players from several North American Nations right here to Delaware County. The Gold Cup is the major event for the Confederation of North, Central America and Caribbean Football. The Gold Cup Final will be played the next day at Lincoln Financial Field. Also new this year, PPL Park will hold its first rock concert called the *Monster Energy Rock Allegiance Festival* that will be held on Saturday, October 10.

The Philadelphia Union and Keystone Sports and Entertainment are also committed to giving back to the community. They have a Safe Playgrounds Initiative, a School Supply Drive, a Youth Soccer Program, a Hometown Heroes Program and the Union Foundation.

Mr. McBlain further said County Council and the Union are committed to making sure that all residents can enjoy the stadium. Every year, PPL Park and the Delaware County Chamber hosts Delco Night when they offer county residents a discount on tickets. Residents can just go to the Philadelphia Union website and put in the code "DELCO2015" to get tickets. All members of County Council plan to attend Delco Night and join the Sons of Ben in a chorus of Doop......doop.

This morning, County Council recognizes the Philadelphia Union and the Sons of Ben. We also have the pleasure of giving away some tickets for Delco Night at PPL Park to a very worthy group, the Community Action Agency of Delaware County, which serves people in need.

Mr. McBlain called on Pat Killian, Commerce Director of Delaware County, and Carl Cherkin, Vice President of Business Relations, to come forward to accept a Resolution announcing Delco Night at PPL Park. He also called on Bob Boland, board member of the Delaware County Chester Waterfront Industrial Development Authority.

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Mr. Cherkin said this was a wonderful marriage of the private sector and certainly the governmental sector that enabled PPL Park to be built during the worst economic time. PPL Park and the Philadelphia Union have been a labor of love for all of us. It is easy to speak from the heart because he has wanted to bring major league soccer here from the beginning when it started in 1996. Delaware County became a partner with Jay Sugarman, Chairman and Owner, and Nick Sakiewicz, Chief Executive Officer and Operating Partner, which was nothing short of a miracle and because of Council's creativity and commitment to getting this done, it happened.

Over 400 tickets for Delco Night at PPL Park have already been sold with their goal to sell many more tickets before the event. This is a partnership that benefits everyone; it is not about taking but it's about giving as much as they possibly can. He thanked everyone for enabling them to find a tremendous home and a great place to live and play.

Mr. McBlain said County Council would now like to recognize the Sons of Ben.

The Sons of Ben Fan Club started in 2007, years before there was even a soccer franchise in the Delaware Valley. In fact, members of the Sons of Ben attended a Delaware County Council meeting in 2007 when plans were being made to construct the soccer stadium in Chester.

This fan club started with a handful of diehard soccer fans who didn't even have a team. Today, there are 1,500 Sons of Ben, beating their giant drum and singing their clever songs in a special section at PPL Park called "The River End." If you've ever been to a Philadelphia Union game, you know how much excitement and enthusiasm the Sons of Ben members add to the experience.

Their enthusiasm goes beyond soccer. They donate their time and talent to many worthwhile causes including their "Help Kick Hunger Campaign" that benefits the food cupboard at the Bernardine Center, in Chester.

Now, the Sons of Ben are starring in a film documentary, "Sons of Ben: The Movie" that opens with a red carpet premiere in Philadelphia on June 10. This film documents the journey of the Sons of Ben in bringing Major League Soccer to the Delaware Valley. The documentary has already won awards in Spain and Tokyo. Local fans will enjoy seeing Delaware County natives Bryan James, Corey Furlan and Brad Young in the film along with Senator Dominc Pileggi and former Chester Mayor Wendell Butler.

County Council is pleased to welcome Bill Gusler, the Sons of Ben Director of Philanthropy, to tell us a bit about the Sons and the new documentary.

Mr. Gusler said the Sons of Ben Fan Club are now over 2,000 strong. The Sons of Ben wanted a major league soccer team in Philadelphia and became the supporters group for the Philadelphia Union. Not only do they show up on every match day and go to the away matches, they have decided it was important to give back to the community, which started with the Help

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Kick Hunger Campaign (a food drive). They have since expanded to a unified soccer program, Special Olympics and are involved with the Delco SPCA. Last year, they raised over \$75,000.00 for the different charities they are involved with and collected over 25,000 pounds of food for the Bernardine Center.

Mr. McBlain said when Delaware County was looking for the commitment to assist in building the stadium, which was step one, there also had to be the commitment from Major League Soccer in order to put the team here and to expand the league.

There is no doubt in his mind that PPL Park would not have been built if it were not for the Sons of Ben and their support. They showed the County, the State and Major League Soccer that this was going to work in Delaware County. The Sons of Ben is more than a fan club; they are supporters of the Union League, the City of Chester and Delaware County.

Chairman Civera called on Mr. White to present tickets for Delco Night at PPL Park.

Mr. White said County Council is pleased to be able to donate soccer tickets to various community groups to ensure that everyone has access to PPL Park and to see a Union match. Today, we are presenting a set of tickets to Ed Coleman, Executive Director of the Community Action Agency of Delaware County, for the 2015 Delco Night at PPL Park to be held on Wednesday, June 24 at 7:00 P.M. The Community Action Agency is the county's anti-poverty agency and the staff assists many residents who are facing hunger and homelessness.

Mr. Coleman thanked County Council for this generous contribution. The tickets will be used by children at the Wesley House, in the City of Chester. Certainly they like to promote events so the children can get out of the shelter and into the community to experience what it is like to go to a professional sporting event.

Chairman Civera announced the flying of the United States Army flag in commemoration of the 240th anniversary of its establishment on June 14, 1775. During 2015, we in Delaware County will once again fly the flags of our five service branches, the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Coast Guard in observance of their anniversaries and in tribute to those who served since our nation's founding. This morning the first of the five flags, the U. S. Army flag, was raised from the flagpoles in the Courtyard of the Government Center and Courthouse Complex, which will be flown through the Army's birth date of June 14, which is also Flag Day.

U. S. Army veteran, Bill Dondero attended this morning's Council meeting to represent the U. S. Army. Mr. Dondero served in the U. S. Army who served in Iraq in convoy operations for 15 months, from November 2007 through January 2009. He is a missile technician who served on active duty from 2006 through 2010 and is currently the district representative for military and veterans issues for U. S. Rep. Patrick Meehan.

Chairman Civera called on Mrs. Morrone to continue with the Agenda Items.

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Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving Item 14, the request by the Controller's Office for payment of current bills, seconded by Mr. McBlain and carried unanimously.

SOLICITOR: Mr. Maddren said County Council is aware the county has a program where we offer properties that are held in the Repository to their host municipalities that have gone through the Upset Price Sales and Judicial Sales. This week we have two municipalities who we are deeding properties to, namely Aston Township and Trainer Borough.

Aston Township Commissioner Carol Graham was here today to accept the deeds for two properties, one on Lenni Road and the second property on Mount Road, that are going to use for open space.

Trainer Borough is acquiring four properties at various locations within the borough through the Repository, which they intend to use as open space. (They did not have a representative at the meeting to receive the deeds.)

Mr. Maddren asked for Council's authorization to file six (6) Petitions for the Involuntary Termination of Parental Rights with the Orphans Court.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone to approve the filing of six (6) Petitions for the Involuntary Termination of Parental Rights with the Orphans Court, seconded by Mr. White and carried unanimously.

COUNCIL: Mr. Culp thanked Springfield Ford & Lincoln for holding these great events and he encouraged everyone to attend the event on Saturday at Springfield Mall. He wished the Philadelphia Union and the Sons of Ben good luck in the remainder of the soccer season. Lastly, he wished everyone good luck in the upcoming Senior Games.

Mr. McBlain recognized Paul Mullin, Business Manager of IBEW 654, who announced he has thrown his hat into the running for the PA State Legislature. He wished him good luck.

Mrs. Morrone congratulated PPL Park and the Sons of Ben for their 6th year. Last year she attend Delco Night at PPL Park and said this is a great opportunity for Delaware County residents to get to the park and support the team.

Chairman Civera thanked everyone who attended today's County Council Meeting. He said the debate to build the soccer stadium and to bring a Major League Soccer team to Delaware County was ongoing in Harrisburg, also. It was between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the County and the Sons of Ben who put this altogether. The County is very proud of the stadium and how it's all working out.

DISCUSSION: No public comment(s).

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There being no further County business, nor public discussion, motion made by Chairman Civera to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mr. Culp and carried unanimously.
