INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING AS A CANDIDATE OF A MINOR POLITICAL PARTY 2025 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

The following instructions relate to the filing of nomination papers by candidates of minor political parties for public offices. For elections in 2025 **only the Libertarian Party qualifies as a minor political party** under the definition in the Pennsylvania Election Code. 25 P.S. § 2872.2. All other parties are defined as political bodies, which have similar (but not identical) requirements for their candidates.

Nomination papers should not be confused with nomination petitions, which are the forms used by candidates to access the primary election ballot for the Democratic Party and Republican Party.

1. WHO MAY FILE

Individuals who wish to be candidates of minor political parties must file nomination papers, Form DSBE MPP. The name of each candidate must be listed, **if required by the minor political party's rules**, on the Authorization of Candidacy filed with the Bureau of Elections by the minor political party named in the nomination papers. A candidate who has filed nomination petitions to appear on the primary election ballot of the Democratic Party or Republican Party may not file nomination papers as a minor political party candidate for the Municipal Election.

2. NAME OF CANDIDATES:

The name of each candidate, their occupation, and their place of residence with street and number must be listed. The office for which such candidate is nominated (including district number if applicable) must also be listed. More than one candidate, and candidates for more than one office, may be nominated by one set of nomination papers, provided that all the signers on each nomination paper are qualified to vote for all the candidates nominated by such nomination paper.

3. NAME OF MINOR POLITICAL PARTY:

The name of the minor political party nominating the candidates named in the nomination paper must be entered on each nomination paper page. Such name cannot be more than three (3) words and shall not be identical or deceptively similar to any words used in the name of an existing political party, or of any political body that has already filed nomination papers for the same office.

4. NUMBER OF SIGNATURES REQUIRED:

Statewide - As a result of a federal district court order, the Secretary of the Commonwealth **is not enforcing the two percent calculation contained in Section 951(b) of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 2911(b), for offices to be filled by the voters of the entire State** to nomination papers filed by the Constitution Party, the Green Party and the Libertarian Party. *See* Order at 1-2, *Constitution Party of Pa. v. Cortés*, No. 12-2726 (E.D. Pa. Feb. 1, 2018). Rather,

candidates for all statewide offices must gather 2,500 signatures, except for the offices of President of the United States, United States Senator, or Governor, which require 5,000 signatures.

District - The minimum number of signatures required on nomination papers for candidates nominated for any office elected by district is equal to two percent of the largest vote cast for any officer, except a judge of a court of record, elected at the last preceding election in the electoral district for which the nomination papers are to be filed, and shall not be less than the number of signers required for nomination petitions of political party candidates for the same office. The Bureau of Elections will furnish the figures for all offices for which nomination papers are filed with the Secretary of the Commonwealth. For other offices, consult your County Board of Elections.

5. QUALIFICATION OF SIGNERS:

Signers of nomination papers must be qualified, registered electors of the Commonwealth and district and of the respective county in which the nomination papers are circulated. Different pages must be circulated for residents of different counties. Each signer must personally sign their name. Each signer must also insert their printed name, residence, and the date of signing on the nomination papers. The date of signing may be expressed in words or numbers (e.g., March 12, 2025, or 3/12/25). The elector's signature and residence should match the information that appears on their voter registration card. *NOTE:* In the case of an elector having a Rural Route or Rural Delivery address, the township should be listed. As a result of a federal district court order, the Secretary of the Commonwealth **is not enforcing the prohibition on signing more nomination papers than there are persons to be elected and offices to be filled**, in section 951(c) of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 2911(c), for nomination papers filed by the Green Party and the Libertarian Party. *See Green Party of Pa. v. Aichele*, 89 F. Supp. 3d 723 (E.D. Pa. 2015).

6. FILING DATES:

The first day to circulate and file nomination papers is March 12, 2025, and the last day to circulate and file is August 1, 2025.

7. STATEMENTS AND AFFIDAVITS:

- a) Statement of Circulator *Every* nomination paper page must have the "Statement of Circulator" filled in and signed *after* all signatures have been obtained. Recent amendments to section 951(d) of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 2911(d), have eliminated the **in-state** residency requirement and the affidavit requirement for circulators of nomination papers for all minor political parties.
- b) Candidate's Affidavit Each candidate for public office must execute and file one Candidate's Affidavit with their nomination paper. The Candidate's Affidavit is a separate form and may be obtained from the Bureau of Elections, Room 210 North Office Building, Harrisburg, PA 17120. Act 2020-15, signed into law on April 20, 2020, allows a candidate to sign an unsworn statement and submit it along with the candidate's affidavit and paper packet instead of notarizing the candidate's affidavit. The unsworn statement will be available for download on the Department's Running for Office web page.

c) Statement of Financial Interests - Candidates for all public offices, except President and Vice President of the United States, United States Senator, and Representative in Congress, are required to submit with their nomination papers a copy of the State Ethics Commission's Statement of Financial Interests. Candidates should contact the State Ethics Commission, 309 Finance Building, PO Box 11470, Harrisburg, PA 17108-1470, (800) 932-0936 with questions regarding the Statement of Financial Interests form. Please refer to the back of the Statement of Financial Interests to find the appropriate office in which to file the original copy of this form.

8. ASSEMBLING NOMINATION PAPERS:

Each page must be numbered consecutively. Pages are double-sided; the front and back must reflect the same page number.

9. WHERE TO FILE:

Nomination papers for all county and local offices must be filed in the office of the County Board of Elections. All nomination papers, required affidavits, and filing fees for federal and state offices must be **RECEIVED** in the office of the Bureau of Elections, Room 201 North Office Building, Harrisburg, PA 17120 no later than 5:00 P.M. on August 1, 2025.

10. FILING FEES:

For Statewide offices (Superior Court and Commonwealth Court), the filing fee is \$200.00. For district offices (Court of Common Pleas and Municipal Court), the filing fee is \$100.00. The filing fee must be presented with the nomination paper and must be made by CERTIFIED CHECK or MONEY ORDER payable to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. A separate filing fee must be submitted for each candidate named in the nomination paper.

NOTE: All dates and information contained herein are subject to change without notice in the event of passage of any amendatory legislation during the 2025 Session of the Pennsylvania General Assembly.

The following information is a supplement to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Instructions for filing as a candidate of a Political Body.

You may download the Nomination Paper, Political Body packet on the Bureau of Elections webpage, <u>www.delcopa.gov/vote/candidates</u>.

- NUMBER OF SIGNERS: For all county or local level nominations, the minimum number of signatures required is two (2)
 percent of the largest entire vote cast for any officer (except a judge of a court of record) elected at the last preceding
 election held in the same electoral district, but it may not be less than the number required for nomination petitions for
 political party candidates for the same office (exceptions to this rule apply to new electoral districts). The Delaware County
 Bureau of Elections will furnish the figures for all offices for which nomination papers are filed with the County Bureau of
 Elections.

- 2. **ASSEMBLING NOMINATION PAPERS**: When more than one page is used, they must be fastened or bound together, and each page must be numbered consecutively.
- 3. CANDIDATE'S AFFIDAVIT AND ETHICS STATEMENT: Each candidate for public office must sign and submit one CANDIDATE'S AFFIDAVIT per set of nomination papers. The CANDIDATE'S AFFIDAVIT is a separate form and may be obtained from the Delaware County Bureau of Elections, 201 W. Front Street, Ground Floor, Media, PA 19063 or on our webpage (www.delcopa.gov/vote/candidates). Act 2020-15, signed into law on April 20, 2020, allows a candidate to sign an unsworn statement and submit it along with the candidate's affidavit and paper packet instead of notarizing the candidate's affidavit. The unsworn statement is part of the Delaware County Nomination Paper packet.
- 4. Each candidate for **County or local level public office** must submit with their nomination papers a copy of the Statement of Financial Interests, the form is required to be filed with the governing office overseeing the office sought. Refer to the reverse side of the Statement of Financial Interest form to determine the proper location.
- 5. FILING FEES: County and Local Offices
 - \$100.00 County Wide Offices
 - County Council
 - Controller
 - Register of Wills
 - Sheriff
 - \$ 50.00 Magisterial District Judge
 - \$ 25.00 City Council
 - \$ 10.00 Constable

The filing fee must be presented with the nomination paper and must be made by CERTIFIED CHECK or MONEY ORDER payable to the Delaware County Treasurer. A separate filing fee must be submitted for each candidate named in the nomination paper.

6. TIME AND PLACE TO FILE: County and Local Offices

Nomination papers for offices supervised by the Delaware County Bureau of Elections are filed in the Delaware County Bureau of Elections, 201W. Front Street, Ground Floor, Media, PA and must be filed no later than 4:30 P.M. on the August 1, 2025 deadline.

The term does not include individuals whose activities are limited to teaching.

A former public official or former public employee must file the year after termination of service with the Commonwealth or political subdivision.

E <u>Solicitors</u> - Persons elected or appointed to the office of solicitor for political subdivision(s).

STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS INSTRUCTIONS

Please print neatly in capital letters. If you require more space than has been provided, please attach an 8 1/2" x 11" piece of paper to the form. Blocks 01 through 06 are for current information.

- Block 01 Enter your last name, first name, middle initial and suffix (if applicable) in the spaces provided. Public office candidates should use the exact name used on official nomination petition or papers.
- Block 02 List an office (business or governmental) or home address and daytime telephone number.
- Block 03 Check the box or boxes to indicate your status. See definitions on front page. If you are correcting a prior filing, please check the box designating an amended form.
- Block 04 Check the appropriate box (seeking, hold, held) for each position you list in the blocks below. List all public position(s) which you are seeking, currently hold, or have held in the prior calendar year. Please be sure to include job titles and official titles such as "member" or "commissioner" (even if serving as an alternate/designee).
- **Block 05** List all Commonwealth agency(ies) or political subdivision(s) as to which you: (1) are presently seeking a public position or public office as a candidate (incumbent or non-incumbent) or nominee; (2) presently hold public office(s) or public employment; and/or (3) previously held a public office(s) or public employment during all or any portion of the calendar year listed in block 07. (The term "political subdivision" includes a county, city, borough, incorporated town, township, school district, vocational school, county institution, district, and any authority, entity or body organized by the aforementioned).
- Block 06 List your current occupation or profession. This information may be the same as stated in block 04.
- **Block 07** List the calendar year for which you are filing this form. Like tax returns, the form discloses financial information for a <u>prior</u> calendar year. For example, for the form due May 1, 2025, block 07 would read "2024." The information in blocks 08 through 15 should represent financial interests for the calendar year listed in Block 7.
- Block 08 REAL ESTATE INTERESTS: List the address of any property which was involved in transactions (leasing, purchasing, or condemnation proceedings of real estate interests) with the Commonwealth or any other governmental body within the Commonwealth. If you have no direct or indirect interests in such a property, then check "NONE."
- Block 09 CREDITORS: List the name and address of any creditor and the interest rate of any debt over \$6,500 regardless of whether such debt is held solely by you or jointly by you and any other individual, including your spouse, where each obligor is fully responsible for the obligation. A joint obligation with other persons for which the filer is responsible only for a proportional share that is less than the reporting threshold, is not required to be reported. Do not report a mortgage or equity loan on your home (or secondary home), or loans or credit between you and your spouse, child, parent or sibling. Car loans, credit cards, personal loans and lines of credit must be listed on the form if the balance owed was in excess of \$6,500 at any time during the calendar year. If you do not have any reportable creditor, then check "NONE."
- **Block 10** DIRECT OR INDIRECT SOURCES OF INCOME: List the name and address of each source of \$1,300 or more of gross income - including but not limited to gross income from the public position - regardless of whether such income is received solely by you or jointly by you and another individual, such as a spouse. "Income" includes any money or thing of value received or to be received as a claim on future services or in recognition of services rendered in the past, whether in the form of a payment, fee, salary, expense, allowance, forbearance, forgiveness, interest, dividend, royalty, rent, capital gain, reward, severance payment, proceeds from the sale of a financial interest in a corporation, professional corporation, partnership or other entity resulting from termination/withdrawal therefrom upon assumption of public office or employment or any other form of recompense or combination thereof. The term refers to gross income and includes prize winnings and tax-exempt income but does not include gifts, governmentally-mandated payments or benefits, retirement, pension or annuity payments funded totally by contributions of the public official or employee, or miscellaneous incidental income of minor dependent children. Filers are not required to list income amounts. If you do not have ANY reportable source of income, then check "NONE."
- Block 11 *GIFTS: For each source of gifts(s) valued at \$250 or more in the aggregate, list the following information: the name and address of the source; the circumstances, including a description of each gift; and the value of the gift(s). Do not report political contributions otherwise reportable as required by law, gift(s) from friends or family members (the term "friend" does not include a registered lobbyist or employee of a registered lobbyist), or any commercially-reasonable loan made in the ordinary course of business. The Commission has held that a person cannot be deemed a "friend" if that person and/ or a business with which that person is associated is regulated by or has contracts with the public official's governmental body. If you did not receive any reportable gift, then check "NONE."
- Block 12 <u>*TRANSPORTATION, LODGING OR HOSPITALITY EXPENSES</u>: List the name and address of each source and the amount of each payment/reimbursement by the source for transportation, lodging or hospitality that you received in connection with your public position <u>if the aggregate amount of</u> <u>such payments/reimbursements by the source exceeds \$650 for the calendar year for which you are reporting</u>. Do not report reimbursements made by a governmental body or by an organization/association of public officials/employees of political subdivisions that you serve in an official capacity. If you do not have any reportable expense payments/reimbursements, then check "NONE."
- Block 13 OFFICE, DIRECTORSHIP OR EMPLOYMENT IN ANY BUSINESS ENTITY: List the name and address of the business entity for any office that you hold (Example: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer), any directorship that you hold (through service on a governing board such as a board of directors), and any employment that you have in any capacity whatsoever as to any business entity. This block focuses solely on your status as an officer, director or employee, regardless of income. If you do not have any office, directorship or employment in any business entity to report, then check "NONE."
- Block 14 FINANCIAL INTERESTS: List the name and address and interest held in any business for profit of which you own more than 5% of the equity or more than 5% of the assets of economic interest in indebtedness. If you do not have any such financial interest to report, then check "NONE."
- Block 15 TRANSFERRED BUSINESS INTERESTS: List the name and address of any business in which you transferred a financial interest (as defined in block 14 above) to a member of your immediate family (parent, spouse, child, brother or sister), as well as the interest held, relationship to the individual, and date of transfer. If you did not transfer any such business interest, then check "NONE."
- Sign the form and enter the <u>current</u> date. <u>Back dating the form is a violation of law and could result in the initiation of civil, administrative and/or</u> <u>criminal penalties</u>.

*Please note the Commission has long held that the receipt of things of value, such as gifts, transportation, lodging and hospitality from vendors, those regulated, and others, may form the basis for a conflict of interest under Section 1103(a) of the Ethics Act.

In 2025, <u>statewide</u> offices appearing on the ballot include the following:

SECOND FRIDAY PRE- and THIRTY DAY POST-PRIMARY or ELECTION REPORTS are required to be

filed by all candidates appearing on the ballot and all political committees and lobbyists that have made expenditures to influence the election of such candidates. In 2025, offices appearing on the ballot include:

<u>ANNUAL REPORTS</u> must be filed by *all* candidates, political committees and contributing lobbyists that have not filed a termination report.

****SPECIAL ELECTIONS**** - In the event of any special election, candidates and committees should contact our bureau regarding reporting requirements and filing deadlines. A separate report will need to be filed for each Special Election Cycle. Special Elections do not follow the reporting dates for Cycles 1-7. Information regarding Special Election reporting dates can be found on our <u>website</u>.

PENALTIES - In accordance with the Campaign Finance Reporting Law, those who file required reports after the filing deadline are assessed a late filing fee of \$20 per day for the first six days that a report is late, and \$10 per day thereafter, up to a maximum penalty of \$250 for each report.

NOTARIZED COVER PAGES - The Department allows ten (10) calendar days for the notarized cover page to be received in our office before the report is marked late. In the event that the notarized cover page is not received timely, a late fee will be assessed *from the date of the report filing deadline*. The Department <u>does</u> not accept postmarks for the cover pages.

POLITICAL COMMITTEE TREASURERS - It is the treasurer's responsibility to file required committee reports. Keep this schedule available for reference prior to each reporting deadline. If you need a reporting form, you may print one from the Department's <u>website</u> or request one from the bureau. You may also file your report online. From the website, select the link to Campaign Finance and then to Online Filing for more information. Please remember that all <u>reports must include your filer identification number</u> on the cover page.

24 HOUR REPORTING - Section 1628 of the Campaign Expense Reporting Law, 25 P.S. § 3248, requires any candidate or political committee, authorized by a candidate and created solely for the purpose of influencing an election on behalf of that candidate, which receives any contribution or pledge of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more, <u>or</u> any person making an independent expenditure of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more after the final pre-election/pre-primary report has been deemed completed shall report such contribution or expenditure to the appropriate supervisor. The candidate, chairperson or treasurer of the political committee shall send the report of late contributions within twenty-four (24) hours of receipt of the contribution. The same shall apply to persons making independent expenditures. The bureau will accept the filing of 24 *Hour Reports* by facsimile at 717-705-0721, via e-mail at: <u>ra-stcampaignfinance@pa.gov</u> or <u>online</u>. The filing of reports by facsimile or e-mail is permitted <u>only</u> for 24 *Hour Reports;* it is <u>not</u> permitted for filing other campaign finance reports. The filing of late contribution reports does not remove the obligation to also report those contributions on the appropriate post-election/post-primary expense report filing and they should also be included in a post-election report. Please contact our office for specific reporting dates for late contribution reports.
