Comprehensive Plan Goals:

- 1. Preservation of the Township's remaining open spaces and natural resources
- 2. Traffic congestion at the PA 3 /PA 252 intersection and its spillover effects on surrounding roads
- 3. The need for trails and sidewalks to enable walking for both recreation and for access to destinations within and outside of the Township
- 4. Development form (i.e., development that is consistent with existing neighborhood form and character, and a town center that is cohesive, walkable, and aesthetically pleasing)

Land Use: Provide for future use of land in a manner that will preserve and restore the community's small-town, suburban-rural character and enhance its social and economic vitality.

Housing: Provide for housing that meets the needs of current and future Township residents, and is in harmony with the Township's historical and natural environments

Transportation / Circulation: Provide for a safe and efficient transportation system that facilitates vehicular traffic and accommodates public transportation and pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure

Natural Resources: Protect the Township's natural features, which are critical to residents' health and to the community's suburban-rural character

Historic Resources: Protect the Township's historic buildings, structures, sites, and landscapes, which represent the Township's heritage and contribute to its identity

Community Facilities and Utilities: Provide community facilities, services, and utilities as needed to ensure a functional, safe, healthy, and economically viable community
