Triple P Parenting Program (CP 022322) Request for Proposal

- Is this Triple P Parenting Program service being considered as a potential remote service or face to face exclusive? We are anticipating the Triple P would be provided face to face, however we are cognizant that this could change if there are changes in public health recommendations.
- What is the expected credential of the staff that would be selected to provide the training? Training for Triple P must be provided by accredited trainers through Triple P. Information about training can be found at <u>US - Triple P</u> or through the EPIS Center - <u>Welcome to EPIS | EPIS (psu.edu)</u>
- Does this RFP seek a single provider that serves families with children up to age 12 or are you
 considering providers that serve a subset of this age group, i.e., organizations that work with families
 with children 0-3 or 0-5? The Request for Proposal is seeking a single provider of service that serves
 families with children up to the age of twelve years, however we would consider proposals submitted by
 providers that serve a subset of this age group.
- Do we include the costs of training in our budget? Yes, you can include training costs in your budget proposal.
- Do you have a budget cap for the RFP? We would like to cap the budget at \$247,500.
- Do you want an hourly rate or a program-funded rate? The agency will consider proposals for both program funding and per diem funding.
- What (if any) licensure requirements are needed to be eligible to respond to the RFP? There are no licensure requirements needed to be eligible to respond the Department of Human Services Triple P Parenting Program Request for Proposal.
- What funding source(s) will the county use to support the Triple P contract? The first year of funding, the County will utilize Family First Transition Act funds. Child Welfare special grant funding will be utilized in subsequent years.
- Is the first year of the Triple P project program funded? The first year of the Triple P Parenting Program can be program funded.
- What is the term of the contract? Is it one fiscal year? The term of any contract with the Delaware County Department of Human Services resulting from a successful proposal will be one year and is subject to the availability of local, state, and federal funds as well as County Council's approval.
- What amount of time of the contract year is designated for ramp-up for the hiring of staff/ Triple P training? It would be preferred that the hire and training of staff be completed within the first three months of any resulting contract.
- Will there be an opportunity for a multi-year contract upon successful first year for sustainability? The Delaware County Department of Human Services reviews contracts each fiscal year and submits our existing contracts to County Council for renewal consideration on an annual basis.
- Is there a timeframe in which the county would like to see the Triple P (10 sessions) completed with families at the practice level? This could be flexible based on the needs of the family.
- Is the county open to other Triple P offerings (in addition to Level 4 Standard) that an agency can deliver such as Teen Triple P and/ or Level 4 Standard Group? After successful implementation of Level 4 standard, the agency would be open to expanding the Triple P offerings.
- Does the county prefer to have dedicated Triple P practitioners for this contract or practitioners who are embedded in other child welfare service roles operating in Delco? The Delaware County Department of Human Services has no preference.
- Is the projected number of 25 caregivers to be served all unique families/ situations or does it allow for multiple caregivers to be engaged who are involved with one case? It does allow for multiple caregivers to be engaged who are involved with one case.

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- What cultural and linguistic considerations has the county identified for Triple P? The Department of Human Services currently contracts for interpreter services if the need is indicated.
- What is the referral base and/or level of involvement with county CYS for Triple P referrals? Families referred for Triple P would be accepted for and receiving services from the agency.
- What risk factors does CYS hope to impact with Triple P? Triple P will be utilized with families with children experiencing behavioral issues to reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect.
- Has the county identified any priority populations to be served by Triple P? The priority population will be families accepted for services by Children and Youth Services with children at significant risk of out of home care.
- Do you want an hourly rate or a program-funded rate? The Department of Human Services will consider proposal for both program funding and/or per diem funding.
- Will all referrals come from Children and Youth Services? Yes, all referrals will come from the Department of Human Services, Children & Youth Services.
- When will services be expected to start? We hope to have all final negotiations completed and presented to our Council for consideration and approval for a 7/1/22 start time and anticipate three months for training and staffing.
- Will referrals ramp up or does CYS expect all 25 families or a large group of them to start at once? Referrals will ramp up, not all families will start at once.
- What type of reporting is CYS looking for from the provider and how often? Children and Youth Services would want a written report mid-way through the program and at the completion of the program. We would also need sign-in sheets for auditing purposes.
- Will the child's Children and Youth Services case worker be involved in the Triple P program? Is the parent court ordered to participate in the program? The caseworker will make the referral and should maintain contact with the Triple P provider. While participation is voluntary, there may be some parents who are Court-Ordered to participate.
- What is the total budget for the program? The budget for the first year should not exceed \$247,500.
- We understand the funding through this RFP is for one year. Is there a possibility for contract extension or will the program end after year one? Delaware County Department of Human Services reviews contracts each fiscal year and submits our existing contracts to County Council for renewal consideration on an annual basis.
- What does year two funding look like? A determination has not been made for year two funding at this time.
- Beyond the first year, do you the program expanding to be able to serve kids at other levels? After successful implementation, the agency would consider expanding the program to serve youth at other levels pending state and federal funding and County Council's approval.
- What is the anticipated total amount of year one funding available? The initial year funding should not exceed \$247,500.
- Is there an indirect cost cap? Yes, it is 10%.
- Can you confirm if the per diem rate is only for days a service is provided or if it is for every day that participants are enrolled? If the program is per diem funded, it would only apply to days a service is provided.
- Is participation in the program voluntary or court-ordered? Participation is voluntary, although there is the potential for parent participation to be court-ordered.

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- Can you confirm that you are only looking for individual consultation/services or are groups permitted under this funding opportunity? Is there an expectation outside of the treatment itself (i.e. participate in court hearings or team meetings)? We are looking for individual / consultation services. There may be a need for participation in court hearings and team meetings.
- If a child is referred as needing level 4 but ends up needing level 5 Triple P, what is the expectation of the provider? Currently, we are only looking at implementing Triple P 4, standard.
- Are there any county reporting requirements outside of the standard Triple P model? No
- What are the expectations around assessments? Assessments regarding parent progress should occur as prescribed by the model.
- Is there an expectation that we have a physical space in Delaware County? It would be beneficial to have a physical space in the county, but it is not required
- Is the service expected to occur at a provider location or at CYS? The service should occur at a provider location or in the client home.

- Once training/certification is completed for staff, does that include a train the trainer component for future staff? There would need to be a plan in place for the training for future staff.
- Is per diem based on family or children within each family? Any per diem would be based on the caregiver(s) receiving the service.
- Are there any expectations for reports/assessments in progress for each of the assigned cases? The agency would like to receive a mid-point and closing assessment for each case.
- After the selection process, what is the anticipated date for implementation? After the selection and approval process, our goal would be to implement a contract at the start of the fiscal year.
