

Sober Housing Options

Delaware County Department of Human Services: Office of Drug and Alcohol

The Office of Drug and Alcohol, also referred to as the Single County Authority (SCA) is an administrative office that provides funding for prevention, intervention, treatment services, and recovery housing resources to eligible Delaware County children, adults, and families

Refer to this flyer for resources and explanations of the sober housing options the Delaware County SCA provides.

All programs mentioned within this flyer are funded by the Delaware County Department of Human Services, Office of Drug & Alcohol.

Finaly Home Program

- Intervention designed to assist participants and their families with stabilizing their housing.
- Participants with an Opioid Use Disorder and/or Stimulant Use Disorder who also have criminal justice involvement and are either homeless or at imminent risk for homelessness.
- individuals and families may be eligible for 6 months of financial assistance and case management services for up to 12 months through the contracted provider, Community Action Agency of Delaware County.
- SCA can fund rent payment, to individuals/families, living in leased apartment or house(s).

Halfway House

- Clinically managed low-intensity residential services.
- The purpose is to serve as a bridge between inpatient residential services and independent life. Supported by staff and peers, residents are encouraged to develop life and social skills to better cope with society and recovery.
- The individual living will still be receiving clinical treatment services. This service is for individual adults only who meet the level of care criteria.
- SCA will provide funding for the rate of each day the individual is lining in the halfway house.

Recovery House

- Supportive shared living environment founded on peer support and connection to community service.
- Best suited for individuals leaving inpatient treatment and stepping down to outpatient levels of care who are eligible.
- Rent payments for individuals who qualify. Individuals may be eligible for funding for up to 60 days per fiscal year.
